The introduction of the Social Care and Wellbeing Act (Wales) has introduced additional integrated elements associated with all statutory providers having (and documenting) the 'What matters' conversation.

With the launch of Porth Gofal and the planned launch of Porth Y Gymuned and both services working across both the statutory and 3rd Sectors it has become apparent that different use of terminology and mandatory training can cause concern and obstacles associated with joint working.

By having a joint budget for integrated training will overcome challenges associated with funding appropriate and integrated training packages, which will be open to all three sectors. Even the process of undertaking training together opens opportunities for joint, collaborative working.

The criteria for this scheme to support training packages will be:

- The training open to all three sectors;
- The training addresses an identified need agreed by either the Health Social Care and Wellbeing Exec group or the Ceredigion Steering Group.

To date the identified areas of challenge are:

- Motivational conversations;
- Professional competencies and boundaries;
- Information governance.

The fund will not be restricted to formal training opportunities as it may also include facilitated sessions and room hire.
